# Your Safety

You take part entirely at your own risk. Please note:

- Take care at all road crossings and be aware of and considerate to all road and pavement users.
- Use bridges and underpasses where possible they are marked on the map.
- Do not cross roads shaded as out-of-bounds, you must only use bridges or underpasses for these.

## What is Urban Orienteering?

If you did Beat the Street in Swindon in 2018 or 2019 you will find this very similar.

You will be looking for checkpoints (controls) such as fire-hydrants, lamp posts, post boxes, telegraph poles and signs. When you find them you write down a simple <u>number clue</u>. You will be given a map with numbered circles and each control is located at the centre of the circle. The start is the triangle symbol and the finish is the double circle. The course lengths are direct distances – you are likely to go up to 50% further.

### You will need a pen or pencil

### **Mobile Phone Option - MapRun**

As an alternative you can download the free MapRun-F app to your smartphone. Begin your course by going to the START and your phone will beep every time you are close to a control point. (It may take a couple of seconds to register) Then when you have completed your course go for the final beep at the finish (but make sure you don't go close to the finish before then).

Read the MapRunF Guide to find out how to set up the app. There is also advice on phone settings if needed. Instruction on how to get a paper map will be on the NWO website.
